
Protocol Directorate presents its compliments to all Diplomatic Missions and International Organisations in London and has the honour to refer to the recent briefing meetings, attended by your Single Points of Contact (SPOC), on Project Hermes, hosted by the Metropolitan Police Service at New Scotland Yard.

Following the events of 7 July 2005, Protocol Directorate and the MPS reviewed their communications with the diplomatic community. The result is an improved communications system called Project Hermes.

Project Hermes is a joint Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) and Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) initiative to provide accurate and timely information to the diplomatic community following a Mass Casualty Incident in London.

The project will integrate information from the Metropolitan Police Service and HM Government, and transmit it, via SMS (text), email messages and secure web sites, direct to Diplomatic Missions in London.

The focal point of this new initiative is known as the Diplomatic Missions Information (DMI) Desk.



In a Mass Casualty Incident

- As soon as it is available, information will be transmitted in the following methods:
- A brief summary from MPS to your Mission's nominated mobile phone;
- An e-mail notification sent from Protocol Directorate to the account nominated by you;
- Information posted on the DPG Secured Bulletin Board at:
 https://dpgforum.met.police.uk/ entering the username diplomat and the password notified to your Mission by Diplomatic Protection Group;
- Information posted on the FCO Secure web page at: http://www.fco.gov.uk\protocolwebsite entering the username ProtocolPages and password protocol07. Please note the new password.

In the event of a mass casualty incident, if your Mission knows or thinks that certain nationals from your country are involved, we would ask that your Mission report the details to the MPS Casualty Bureau. The Casualty Bureau fax number will be issued on the day.

The sort of information the Casualty Bureau will need on those thought to be involved is:

- Name
- Address
- Date of birth

- Physical peculiarities (marks, scars etc)
- Clothing worn (if known)
- Jewellery and personal effects
- Reasons believed to have been involved
- Passport number (if available)
- Individual's mobile phone number
- Individual's use of vehicles (especially registration mark)
- Last contact made
- Next of Kin
- Call back number for caller
